

Is buying bottled water breaking your bank?

Is your cistern water safe to drink?

Can you rely on sediment filters alone?

All Coral Bay residents (owners, landlords and renters) can find out if their water supply contains bacteria above the EPA Drinking Water Standard detection limit. HERE IS HOW:

STEP 1

BY FRIDAY, APRIL 27, 2018

Pick-up a sterilized container, register and drop-off a check for **\$20.00**

payable to *Ocean Systems Laboratory*

at the Coral Bay Community Council (CBCC) office

Across the street from the fire station

Monday - Friday (8 am to 5 pm)

STEP 2

ON MONDAY, APRIL 30, 2018 FROM 8:00 AM TO 11:00 AM

Drop-off your sample the CBCC Office

Samples will be transported by CBCC to Ocean System Laboratory, an EPA certified lab on St. Thomas. **Limited to 17** samples on first-come, first-served basis. More testing later - if more than 17 people want to participate, pricing subject to change.
